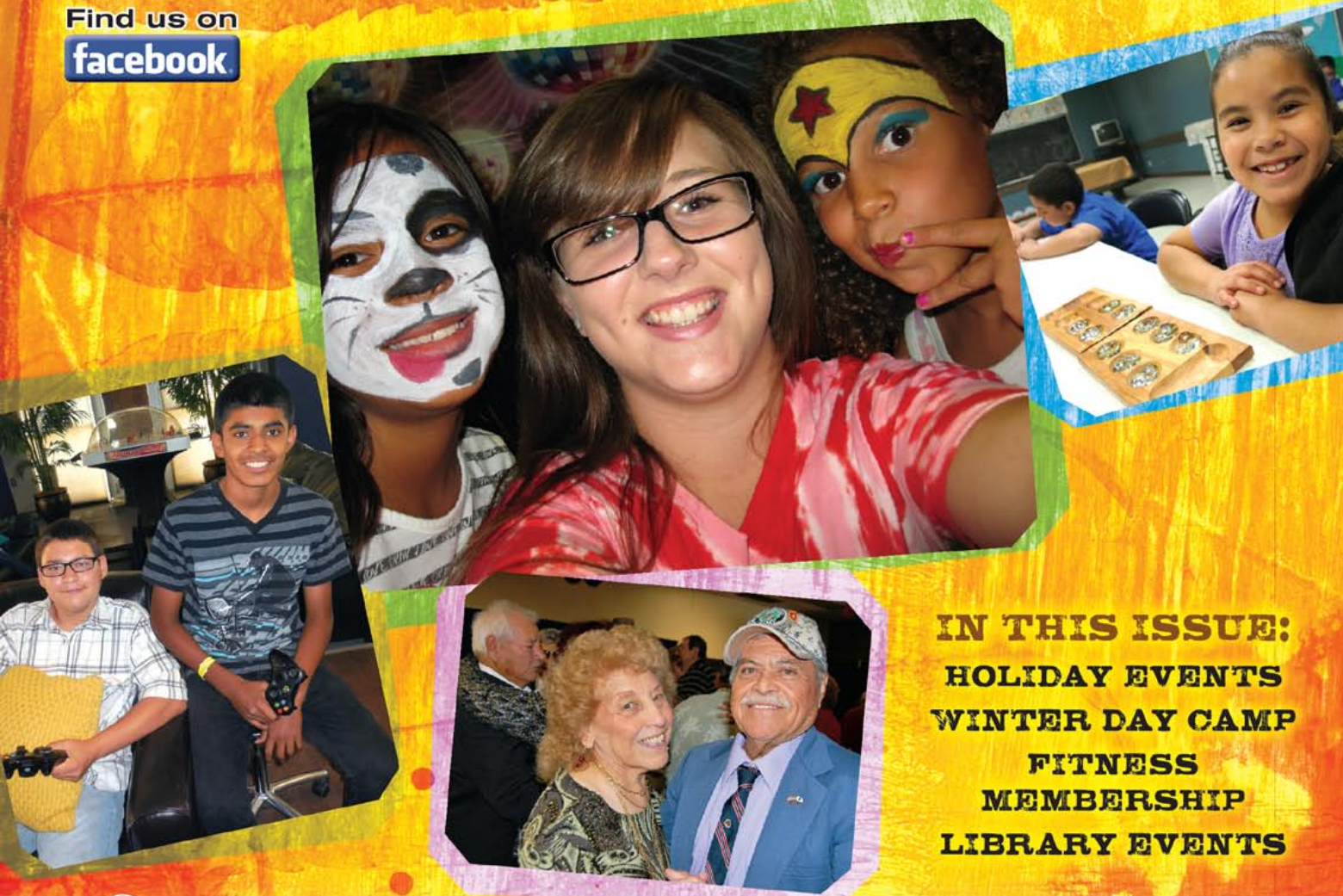

- ◆ Participants must have a pet at the event to enter pool area.

FIVE SMART SUMMERTIME TIPS

Whether cleaning up inside or outside of your home this summer, here are some tips to help make the job easier and more environmentally friendly.

THE HIGH COST OF LITTER

According to the Earth Resources Foundation, the current projected annual cost to public agencies in California for litter prevention, clean up and disposal is \$375.2 million. Primary sources of litter include pedestrians, drivers, household garbage cans, commercial dumpsters, construction sites, loading docks and uncovered trucks. Most of us play a role as a possible source, and we are all impacted by the unsightly and polluting effects of litter. Avoid overfilling your garbage and recycling carts or your materials may fall to the ground before they are dumped into the collection vehicle. The lids on your carts should be closed so that the wind does not cause your garbage and recyclables to become litter on

the street. Shredded paper should be placed inside a paper bag to prevent blow away when the recycling cart is raised up high and tipped into the truck. Many people don't know that litter and pollution from city streets can wind up in storm drains. While storm drains are meant to carry clean rainwater off the roads, any litter and debris that end up in them can actually flow directly into public bodies of water which affect our drinking water and the health of local beaches. Always set the right example and manage your waste responsibly. When you see litter, pick it up and place it in a proper receptacle. The steps we take as individuals will go a long way towards keeping the costs associated with litter in our community from increasing.

REDUCE WASTE AND IMPROVE YOUR SOIL

Is dragging out the lawn mower, cutting the grass and throwing away mounds and mounds of grass clippings a summer tradition for you? Have you ever wondered where all those grass clippings were going? Residents are given a brown cart specifically for green waste which allows residents to separate yard waste from garbage. Yard waste from the brown cart is taken to a facility where it is processed to be used for alternative daily

cover (ADC). A better option for yard waste is grasscycling. On average, yard waste makes up about 15% of all garbage. Next time, instead of raking up all those grass clippings and bagging them, leave them on the lawn. Grass clippings decompose quickly and release valuable nutrients back into the soil.

To get started follow these basic steps: Water and fertilizer in moderation; keep mower blades sharp; cut grass when it is dry; and never remove more than one-third the length of the grass height at once.
