### Preschool Computer Lab

### Smart Storage:

Know which fruits and vegetables stay fresh longer inside or outside the fridge. By storing them for maximum freshness, they will taste better and last longer.

### Inside the Fridge

Apples, berries, and cherries

Grapes, kiwi, lemons, and oranges

Melons, nectarines, apricots, peaches, and plums (after ripening at room temperature)

Avocados, pears, tomatoes (after ripening at room temperature)

Almost all vegetables and herbs

### Outside the Fridge

Bananas, mangos, papayas, and pineapples: store in a cool place

Potatoes / onions: store in a cool, dark place

Basil and winter squashes: store at room temperature - once cut, store squashes in fridge.

### More Food Storage Tips

• If you like your fruit at room temperature, take what you will eat for the day out of the fridge in the morning.

• Many fruits give off natural gases that hasten the spoilage of other nearby produce. Store bananas, apples, and tomatoes by themselves and store fruits and vegetables in different bins.

• Consider storage bags and containers designed to help extend the life of your produce.

• To prevent mold, wash berries just before eating.

The holidays are approaching, and we want to remind you of the holiday collection schedule and help you start the year off right by recycling your holiday tree.

This year, our office will be closed on Monday December 26th and Monday, January 2nd delaying regular collection one day the remainder of the week. We will collect holiday trees beginning Tuesday, Dec. 27th through Saturday, Jan. 7th. Remove all ornaments, lights, and stand from your tree, and then select one of the following options to recycle your holiday tree:

- Use your yard waste container! Cut the branches down so that your tree fits in your yard waste container with the lid closed and will easily slide out when serviced.
- Place holiday trees on the ground alongside (not in front) collection containers. Cut trees larger than 6 feet tall in half. No need to call, we will automatically pick up your tree using a separate collection vehicle between Dec. 27th and Jan. 7th.

To help determine what can be put in residential recycling carts, here's a "Naughty and Nice" list of holiday materials that may be recycled. Regardless of which list an item falls on, we suggest reusing it first, if possible.

### Always Nice

- · Boxes gift, shoe and shipping
- Wrapping paper plain or sparkly
- Tissue paper
- Holiday cards and envelopes without embellishments
- Paper Gift bags
- Glass Bottles
- Aluminum Cans

### Always Naughty

- Bubble wrap
- Ribbons & bows
- Gift bags laminated, coated or dyed
- Cellophane
- Foam Packing peanuts
- Anything on the Christmas tree
- Your Aunt Edna's fruit cake

### Watch List

Some items that are recyclable individually are not recyclable when combined with other recyclable materials. Recycling companies, like Republic, need materials in the purest form possible – any cross contamination of material (metal and paper together; paper and plastic together) make it difficult and more expensive to recycle. So, if possible, separate the materials before putting them in the recycle bin.

### **Toy Containers**

Toy packaging made from heavy cardboard that surrounds a plastic container is not recyclable unless the cardboard is separated from the plastic. That means the plastic window on the box of your favorite doll or action figure.
