Additional bags or bundles of green waste material may be collected as a bulky item. Palm fronds are NOT recyclable. Please place palm fronds in the trash, cart



Recycling Saves Energy

One recycled tin can would save enough energy to power a television for 3 hours.

One recycled plastic bottle save enough energy to power a 60-watt light bulb for 3 hours.

E-Waste

Electronic Waste (e-waste) is anything with a circuit board or battery. It is illegal to dispose of e-waste in any of your automated carts. CR&R will collect and legally dispose of and recycle these items.

Some examples of e-waste include:

Monitors Televisions
Cell Phones Microwaves
Computers Printers

To arrange a curbside pick-up of e-waste, please call CR&R Customer Service.

Why Recycle? It's State Law!

California State Assembly Bill AB 341 and AB 1826 require businesses to recycle.

AB 341 requires businesses that generate four cubic yards of waste weekly and multi-family housing complexes with five or more units to recycle.

AB 1826 requires businesses that generate four cubic yards or more of organic waste per week to recycle.

BULKY ITEMS



Items that cannot fit in your automated carts are considered bulky items. Bulky Items must be manageable by a two-person crew.

Some examples of bulky items include:

Couches Tables
Desks Matteresses
Chairs Excess Green Waste

Residents of Colton, who have the 3-cart trash, recycle and green waste service, will have four (4) free bulky item pick ups per calendar year at their own convenience. Residents must call to schedule the pick up at (909) 370-3377.


