
Class and Program Registration Information

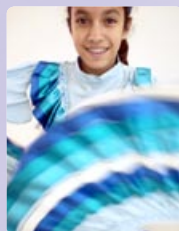

Community Bike Ride Event April 25, 8:30 to 10:00 a.m.



Are you looking for some safe and fun exercise? If so, join us on Saturday, April 25, for a community bicycle ride through the streets of Lawndale. On the morning of April 25, a number of streets in Lawndale will be closed to vehicle traffic in preparation for the annual Youth Day Parade creating a safe atmosphere for those interested in participating.

The bicycle route will begin at the intersection of Manhattan Beach Blvd. and Prairie Avenue and will continue for 2.2 miles along Manhattan Beach Blvd. west, Hawthorne Blvd. north, Marine Avenue east and Prairie Avenue south. The event will not only be open to bicycle riders, it will be open to walkers, joggers, strollers, skateboards, scooters and roller blades. Please be aware that helmet laws for all minors will be in effect. Minors on any type of wheeled equipment must wear a helmet – no exceptions! Bicycles or other equipment that is modified in any way will be ineligible.

This is a free event; however, all participants must register prior to participating. Registrations begin at 7:30 a.m. on the day of the event. Even if you can't be here at 8:30 come late and join the fun. Those that are late can join in after registering. Those interested can also register at the Harold E. Hofmann Community Center during normal operational hours. All minors must have consent paperwork completed on site prior to participating. Children 13 years of age and below must be accompanied by an adult participant. No competitive cyclists or bicycle clubs please. Youth Day Parade and Community Bike Ride Street Closures

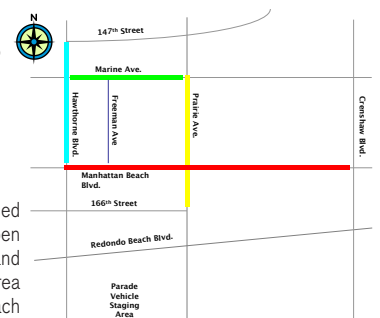
On Saturday, April 25, the Community Bike Ride and annual Lawndale Youth Day Parade will take place at 8:00 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. respectively. Please be aware there will be several street closures from approximately 7:00 a.m. until approximately 1:30 p.m. The following streets will be closed or have traffic flow adjustments:

- Manhattan Beach Blvd. between Crenshaw Blvd. and Hawthorne Blvd.
- Hawthorne Blvd. northbound between Manhattan Beach Blvd. and 147th Street **Note:** Two-way traffic adjustment on southbound side of Hawthorne Blvd. will be in effect
- Marine Avenue between Prairie Avenue and Hawthorne Blvd.
- Prairie Avenue between Marine Avenue and 164th Street

Within the area bounded by Hawthorne Blvd., Marine Avenue, Prairie Avenue and Manhattan Beach Blvd., Freeman Avenue at Marine Avenue and Manhattan Beach Blvd. (see map below) will be the designated points of entry and escape. Those using Freeman Avenue to exit or enter the immediate area may encounter brief delays based on the location of the parade. Street Closures:

- Manhattan Beach Blvd. from Crenshaw Blvd. to Hawthorne Blvd.
- Hawthorne Blvd. northbound from Manhattan Beach Blvd. to 147th Street
- Marine Ave. from Prairie Ave. to Hawthorne Blvd.
- Prairie Ave. from Marine Ave. to 166th Street



Note: All affected streets will be closed no later than 7:00 a.m. and will reopen no later than 1:30 p.m. Escape and entry route inside the parade route area is Freeman Avenue at Manhattan Beach Boulevard and Marine Avenue. Expect intermittent delays.

New Park Coming to Lawndale in 2016!

On March 7, 2011, the City Council approved the purchase of a 1.5 acre property located on Larch Avenue just south of W. 147th Street with the intention of developing the land into a park. Subsequently, the City received \$4 million in California State Proposition 84 grant funding to develop the land into a park. Soon after the land was purchased, a conceptual design was created which was the result of several public outreach workshops in which extensive community input was received. We thank all of the residents who have participated in the numerous public outreach meetings and events. Your participation has helped the City design a park that the children can enjoy and one that everyone will be proud of. Below is the anticipated construction timeline for the park:

USDA Free Food Program

The City of Lawndale Free Food Program is open to people of all ages who qualify that are in need of food. The food is supplied by the Food Bank of Southern California and the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA). The food bank obtains and distributes donations of nutritious food that the City of Lawndale picks up from the warehouse, packs, and distributes weekly. The food received each week varies and oftentimes consists of canned goods and some type of fresh produce.

Food Distribution Information: Food distribution is located at the Harold E. Hofmann Community Center, located at 14700 Burin Avenue, in the third floor Main Event Room. Food is distributed every Wednesday at 10:00 a.m. on a first, come, first served basis to those who qualify until all food is gone. Lines to obtain food form early. Those obtaining food must provide signature confirming that Emergency Food Assistance Program (EFAP) guidelines are met. Looking for Dependable Transportation?

The Lawndale Beat Fixed-Route Transit offers effective transportation solutions within the City of Lawndale at a reasonable cost, and in many cases free of charge. The Lawndale Beat is a seven day per week service consisting of two routes, the Residential and the Express. The Beat will get you nearly anywhere you want to go in Lawndale and links to neighboring transportation systems, such as: Metro, Torrance Transit and Beach Cities (Redondo) Transit at the Metro Green Line Station and the South Bay Galleria. The Lawndale Beat operates Monday thru Friday, 7:00 a.m. to 6:35 p.m.; Saturdays, 8:40 a.m. to 5:55 p.m.; and Sundays, 9:20 a.m. to 5:45 p.m. Fares are an incredible \$0.75! Seniors 62 years of age and older, disabled, children 6 years and younger (with a paying adult) may ride free of charge. Lawndale Residents - You May Qualify for a Measure CL Tax Exemption

On November 6, 2012, Los Angeles County voters in the Lawndale, Hawthorne, Wiseburn, Lennox and Centinela Valley school districts approved Measure CL, a Local Classrooms Funding Authority parcel tax intended to generate approximately \$11 million per year. Residents who own a single family house or condominium in Lawndale may be eligible for a Measure CL tax exemption if you fall into the category of a senior citizen over age 65 or if you qualify for a disability exemption. The deadline to file for an exemption is June 30 of each year. However, you do not have to reapply each year once you begin receiving the exemption. Exemption applications will be available at each elementary school district office, Lawndale City Hall, Harold E. Hofmann Community Center and the Lawndale Library. Seniors – You May Qualify for a Utility Users Tax Exemption

If you are a Lawndale resident senior 65 years or older, meet the Social Security Administration criteria of a blind or disabled person, or income does not exceed the Housing and Urban Development (HUD) established income limits for very low income families, you may qualify for a Utility Users Tax (UUT) break. Crime Prevention Tips Preventing Residential Burglaries

Crime rates are down in the City of Lawndale. To ensure that crime rates remain low, there are steps that you can take to reduce your chances of becoming a victim of a residential burglary. It does not matter if you rent or own your home, do not be a victim.



A residential burglary occurs when a criminal enters your residence with the intent to commit a theft or a felony. Most residential burglaries occur when residents are at work, between 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Criminals look for some of the following elements when searching for a residence to burglarize: 1) an unoccupied residence; 2) a residence that blocks neighbors' view when they are breaking in; 3) residences without an alarm; 4) expensive items inside; and 5) easy access into the home or garage.

What can be done to prevent you from being a victim?

- Keep your doors and windows locked. By keeping your doors and windows locked, it makes it more difficult for criminals to enter your residence. If they are forced to break a window, that creates noise and criminals try to be quiet.
- Keep your garage door closed. By keeping your garage door closed, criminals cannot see what you have in your garage and entry is much more difficult.
- Have a friend pick up your mail and newspapers if you are out of town. Criminals look for these items when choosing which residence to burglarize.
- Set your lights on a timer. If your lights are seen at different times on and off, it looks like someone is home.
- Do not leave evidence of expensive items outside your residence. If you buy a new 60 inch HD television, do not put the box outside in the trash. This announces to criminals that you have just purchased a new television.
- Since more residences are unoccupied during the day when people are at work, have your neighbors keep an eye on your residence and do the same for them.
- Get a residential alarm. If you cannot afford an alarm, purchase an alarm sign or an alarm decal. If a criminal sees evidence that you have an alarm, they will usually move on to a residence that does not have evidence of an alarm.
- Join your neighborhood watch group. You can gain additional knowledge on crime prevention.
- If you see something suspicious, report it.

Do You Need a Special Event Permit?

The City of Lawndale has a special event permit approval process for residents and business owners planning events that take place wholly or partially within the city boundaries which attract a substantial amount of people during any twenty-four hour period, and/or affect the public right of way. A special event can be defined as a commercial or non-commercial event organized by for profit or non-profit organizations held on private or City property. Examples of events that require a permit, but not limited to, are amusement attractions, athletic events, carnivals, circuses, concerts, exhibitions, fairs, fireworks displays, parades, fund-raising events, sidewalk sales, media events, etc.



If you are a resident or a business owner in Lawndale planning such an event, a special event permit may be required. If you are not sure if you need a special event permit, please be sure to contact the Community Services Department at (310) 973-3270, or email mestes@lawndalecity.org to find out. There is no fee to apply, however, if city resources are needed to ensure the event's safety, fees may be applied, or additional permits may be required depending upon the nature of the event. Applications can be obtained from the City's website at www.lawndalecity.org, City Hall Online, Forms link. Hard copy applications may also be obtained by visiting the Community Services Department.

Spring Capital Improvements Program Update

The Public Works Department is pleased to provide you with this quarterly update of the City's Capital Improvement Program (CIP). The program covers street, concrete and traffic improvements (including sidewalk, curb and gutter), parks, and city facilities improvements. Many projects are currently under construction or are in the planning and design phases.

CURRENT PROJECTS

Citywide Traffic Signal Improvements: The City received a \$1.5 million Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transit Authority Measure R Grant to improve several traffic signals in the community that are outdated. The signal upgrades will facilitate traffic, bicycle, and pedestrian movements within the City's transportation network. Some of the traffic signal improvements will include the following elements: full-traffic actuated operation; bicycle and pedestrian use accommodations; timing plans for signals and new controllers, cabinets, conduits, wiring, and detection loops at the following locations: Manhattan Beach Boulevard at Freeman Avenue; Rosecrans Avenue at Jefferson Avenue; Rosecrans Avenue at Ramona Avenue; Rosecrans Avenue at Firmona Avenue; Inglewood Avenue at W. 147th Street (both intersections); Inglewood Avenue at W. 152nd Street; Artesia Boulevard at Inglewood Avenue; Artesia Boulevard at Kingsdale Avenue; Artesia Boulevard at Grevillea Avenue; Prairie Avenue at W. 164th Street; Prairie Avenue at Manhattan Beach Boulevard; Prairie Avenue at W. 154th Street; Prairie Avenue at W. 147th Street; Prairie Avenue at Rosecrans Avenue; Marine Avenue at Firmona Avenue; Marine Avenue at Mansel Avenue; and Marine Avenue at Freeman Avenue.

COMPLETED PROJECTS:

Street and Roadway Improvements: Two projects were in construction in January 2015 to rehabilitate several streets. The roadway improvements were divided into two separate projects given their different funding sources.

The general items of work for the two projects will include cold milling the existing asphalt pavement at variable depths; placement of an asphalt concrete overlay; reconstruction of curb ramps to meet Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requirements; reconstruction of some driveways; sidewalks, curbs and gutters; and other supplementary work.

One project included street and roadway improvements to the following street segments:

- W. 156th Street from Condon Avenue to Hawthorne Boulevard
- W. 153rd Place from Condon Avenue to Mansel Avenue
- Rixford Avenue from Manhattan Beach Boulevard frontage to the end of the cul-de-sac

This project was funded with Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Federal Government Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Section 3 Grant and Proposition C funds. The project broke ground in November and was completed in January.

A second project included street and roadway improvements to the following street segments in the City:

- Burin Avenue from W. 145th Street to Marine Avenue
- W. 169th Street from Hawthorne Boulevard to W. 170th Street
- Freeman Avenue from W. 166th Street to Redondo Beach Boulevard
- Condon Avenue from Rosecrans Avenue to W. 147th Street
- W. 171st Street from Hawthorne Boulevard to Freeman Avenue
- Firmona Avenue from Manhattan Beach Boulevard to Artesia Boulevard

Construction for this project began in December 2014 and was completed in February. This project was funded with Proposition C and Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transit Authority Measure R funds.

William Green Playground Equipment Replacement Project: In May 2014, the City Council authorized staff to bid the Playground Equipment Replacement Project for William Green Park for a second time since a low number of bids had been previously received. The project consisted of complete removal and disposal of the existing playground equipment and footings, removal of existing sand and rubber surfaces, installation of new concrete ramps, purchase and installation of new playground equipment, and replacement of existing rubberized floor surfaces and sand with 12" thick wood chip pads. The project was paid for with Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds and was completed in September 2014 and dedicated to public service. Children have been enjoying the new playground equipment with a "Space" theme for several months now.

Jane Addams and Rogers-Anderson Playground Equipment Replacement Project: The City Council approved the complete replacement of the aging playground equipment at Jane Addams and Rogers-Anderson parks. Each park has exciting playground designs and themes for the children to enjoy. The playground equipment at Rogers-Anderson Park has a "western" theme and the playground equipment at Jane Addams Park has a "castle and tree house" theme. The play areas and equipment at each park comply with current Consumer Products Safety Commission Guidelines and ADA requirements. Construction for this project started in April and is now completed. This project was funded by Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds at a cost of \$480,000 and was completed in September 2014.



Spotlight on Public Works for 4th Quarter 2014

STOP SIGN REPLACEMENT PROJECT: The stop-sign replacement project has been completed in the City. The Public Works Crews replaced faded or damaged stop signs. The new stop signs are reflective and have an anti-graffiti film and will aid drivers during the evening hours, reducing the time spent for graffiti removal. The crew is now replacing street sweeping signs throughout the City.

Consejos para Prevenir los Robos Residenciales

Los índices de criminalidad han bajado en la ciudad de Lawndale. Para asegurar que los índices permanezcan bajos, usted puede tomar ciertas medidas para reducir las posibilidades de convertirse en una víctima de un robo residencial. No importa si usted renta o es dueño de su casa, no se convierta en una víctima.



Un robo residencial ocurre cuando un criminal entra a su residencia con la intención de cometer un robo o una felonía. La mayoría de los robos residenciales ocurren cuando los residentes se encuentran en su trabajo, entre las 9:00 a.m. y las 5:00 p.m. Los criminales buscan algunos de los siguientes elementos cuando buscan una casa que robar: 1) una casa desocupada; 2) una casa que no tiene acceso a que la vean los vecinos cuando la están robando; 3) hogares sin alarma; 4) artículos caros en su interior; y 5) acceso fácil a la casa o al garaje.

¿Qué puede hacer para evitar ser una víctima?

- Mantenga sus puertas y ventanas cerradas con seguro. Al mantener sus puertas y ventanas cerradas con seguro, es más difícil que los criminales se metan a su casa. Si se ven obligados a romper una ventana, eso causaría ruido y los criminales tratan de hacer todo muy silenciosamente.
- Mantenga la puerta de su garaje cerrada. Al mantener la puerta de su garaje cerrada, los criminales no pueden ver lo que tiene usted en el garaje y eso hace que su entrada sea más difícil.
- Si usted está fuera de la ciudad, pídale a un amigo que le recoja el periódico y su correspondencia. Los criminales buscan estos artículos para encontrar la casa que quieren robar.
- Ponga sus luces con un contador de tiempo. Si sus luces se ven que se prenden y se apagan a diferentes tiempos, parecería que hay alguien en la casa.
- No deje evidencia de artículos caros afuera de su casa. Si usted compra una nueva televisión HD de 60 pulgadas, no deje la caja en la basura. Esto les indica a los criminales que usted acaba de comprar una nueva televisión.
- Debido a que la mayoría de las casas están solas durante el día, cuando la gente está en el trabajo, pídeles a los vecinos que le echen un ojo a su casa y usted haga lo mismo por ellos.
- Ponga una alarma residencial. Si no puede pagar por una alarma, compre un letrero de alarma o una calcomanía de alarma. Si el criminal ve que usted tiene una alarma, se seguirá a otra casa que no tenga señas de tener alarma.
- Únase a su grupo de vigilancia vecinal. Podría aprender más sobre la prevención de crímenes.
- Si usted ve algo sospechoso, repórtelo.
